AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

WHEREAS, certain law enforcement officers, who run or administer the breathalyzer tests in connection with the Breath Alcohol Testing Mobile Units and law enforcement officers assigned to the DUI/Step Unit work until the early morning hours during several week days and also work on weekends;

WHEREAS, it is necessary to have reasonable and convenient times for the taking of these officers' depositions;

WHEREAS, it is also necessary that the members of the private bar, as well as the Public Defender's office are apprised of these times for depositions of breathalyzer test officers and law enforcement officers assigned to the DUI/Step Unit and;

WHEREAS, the administrative supervision of the Courts within the Ninth Judicial Circuit is a responsibility of the Chief Judge, as provided in Rule 2.050, Florida Rules of Judicial Administration;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Depositions of all law enforcement officers assigned to the Breath Alcohol Testing Mobile Units and all law enforcement officers assigned to the DUI/Step Unit in Orange County, Florida shall be scheduled in all Orange County traffic court cases during the following days and times:

Tuesday - 1:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m.

Wednesday - 1:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m.

Thursday - 1:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m.

Friday - 1:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m.

2. In the event that there are more depositions than these days and time periods allow, depositions may be scheduled after 5:00 p.m. on these above days.

3. This Administrative Order supersedes and revokes the prior undated Administrative Order entered by the former Judge Lee C. Conser, when he was administrative judge of the County Court. Further, the State Attorney's office for the Ninth Judicial Circuit in all Orange County traffic cases, as part of the discovery furnished the defense, is only requested, but not ordered, to furnish a copy of this Administrative Order to private counsel and to any party representing himself or herself and to indicate in the discovery furnished which witness or witnesses are specifically covered by this Administrative Order.
