ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER ON DOCKETING AND ACCOUNTING FOR EMINENT DOMAIN CASES IN ORANGE COUNTY

WHEREAS, it has come to the Court's attention that the Clerk of Court has considerable difficulty in Eminent Domain cases setting up the proper docketing and accounting for each parcel being condemned when the depository check is in lump sum only;

NOW, THEREFORE I, Frederick Pfeiffer, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Chief Judge of the Ninth Judicial Circuit of the State of Florida order as follows:

That in all Eminent Domain cases the Clerk shall not accept checks for deposit of the court ordered sums unless the check or an attachment identifies, in addition to the case number, the amount to be assigned to each parcel for the taking and the approximate real estate taxes for that parcel.
