

**AMENDED ORDER ESTABLISHING A UNIFIED NINE WEEK CALENDAR FOR  
SCHEDULING PROCEEDINGS IN THE ORANGE COUNTY CRIMINAL DIVISIONS**

**WHEREAS**, the Court finds that the procedures for scheduling proceedings in the County Criminal Divisions of Orange County can be improved by providing a unified calendar; and

**WHEREAS**, the Court finds that the scheduling of arraignments in the County Criminal Divisions can be improved by conducting arraignment hearings during one week of the nine week cycle, instead of daily;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I**, Belvin Perry, Jr., pursuant to the authority vested in me as Chief Judge of the Ninth Judicial Circuit of Florida under Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.050, hereby order the following:

1. Nine Week County Unified Calendar for the County Criminal Divisions: Effective **October 7, 2003**, the nine week calendar for scheduling proceedings in the County Criminal Divisions shall be scheduled as follows:

WEEK ONE: Arraignments shall be conducted by a judge Monday through Friday of week one as follows: Traffic Arraignments at 8:30 a.m, and Misdemeanor arraignments at 1:30 p.m.

WEEKS TWO AND THREE: During weeks two and three, a judge shall prepare for trials and conduct trials assigned to his/her own subdivision, including criminal traffic and misdemeanor cases.

WEEK FOUR: During week four a judge shall conduct arraignment proceedings for all cases at the branch courthouses in Ocoee, Apopka, and Winter Park at 8:30 a.m., one day at each location.

WEEKS FIVE AND SIX: During weeks five and six, a judge shall prepare for trials and conduct trials assigned to his/her own subdivision, including criminal traffic and misdemeanor cases.

WEEK SEVEN: During week seven a judge shall hear motions and other proceedings including sentencings, violation of probation and administrative matters.

WEEKS EIGHT AND NINE: During weeks eight and nine, a judge shall prepare for trials and conduct trials assigned to his/her own subdivision, including criminal traffic and misdemeanor cases.

2. Effective October 7, 2003, Amended Administrative Order No. 2001-01-1 dated October 5, 2001 shall be vacated and set aside.
