## ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER GOVERNING PROBABLE CAUSE AFFIDAVITS

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to Article V, Section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution and section 43.26, Florida Statutes, the chief judge of each judicial circuit is charged with the authority and the power to do everything necessary to promote the prompt and efficient administration of justice; and

WHEREAS, judges sign arrest warrants and search warrants frequently; and

**WHEREAS,** judges rely upon the facts mentioned in the affidavit of probable cause when presented with warrants from law enforcement agencies;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I,** Frederick J. Lauten, in order to facilitate the efficient operation of the administration of justice, and pursuant to the authority vested in me as Chief Judge of the Ninth Judicial Circuit of Florida under Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.215, hereby order that, **effective immediately** unless otherwise provided herein, to continue until further order, and superseding any provisions in prior Administrative Orders which may be inconsistent:

1. All law enforcement agencies must file with the Clerk of the Court the affidavit of probable cause with the signed warrant.

2. The Clerk of Court shall event the affidavit of probable cause as a confidential document immediately upon receipt.

3. The Clerk of Court shall seal the affidavit of probable cause until no longer confidential as defined by the Florida Statutes and the Florida Rules of Court.
