

**AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER DESIGNATING LOCATIONS FOR
CONDUCTING DISCOVERY DEPOSITIONS**

Pursuant to Florida Rule of Criminal Procedure 3.220(3), depositions of witnesses residing in the county in which the trial is to take place shall be taken in the building in which the trial shall be held, such other location as is agreed on by the parties, or a location designated by the court. Depositions of witnesses residing outside the county in which the trial is to take place shall be taken in a court reporter's office in the county or state in which the witness resides, such other location as is agreed on by the parties, or a location designated by the court.

By the power vested in the chief judge under Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution, section 43.26, Florida Statutes, and Rule 2.215 of the Florida Rules of General Practice and Judicial Administration, effective **immediately** unless otherwise provided herein, to continue until further order and superseding any provisions in prior Administrative Orders that may be inconsistent, it is **ORDERED**:

The following locations may be contacted for purposes of conducting discovery depositions. Space is limited. So that everyone can be accommodated, callers are urged to call and reserve space well in advance of the needed time.



3. For trials held at the Judge Jon B. Morgan Osceola County Courthouse, 2 Courthouse Square, Kissimmee 34741, Suite 1500, Florida 34741, please call 407-742-2400.
