ORDER VACATING TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2020-06-15
GOVERNING TRIAL COURT PROCEEDINGS AND ADDRESSING
REMOTE HEARING PROCEDURES

On October 3, 2022, Chief Justice Carlos G. Muniz issued Administrative Order No. AOSC22-51, In Re: Termination of Specified Covid-19 Emergency Operational Measures to Account for New Rules on Remote Conduct of Court Proceedings, eliminating the necessity of Administrative Order 2020-06-15.


By the power vested in the chief judge under Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution, section 43.26, Florida Statutes, and Rule 2.215 of the Florida Rules of General Practice and Judicial Administration, effective **immediately**, unless otherwise provided herein, to continue until further order and superseding any provisions in prior Administrative Orders that may be inconsistent, it is **ORDERED**:

All court facilities in the Ninth Judicial Circuit Court are open to participants, the media and public. All Circuit and County Court Judges, as well as General Magistrates and Hearing Officers must initiate and conduct any remote proceeding, in whole or in part, from their courtrooms, hearing rooms or chambers, regardless of whether the proceeding is to be in-person, remote, or a hybrid of the two.

Administrative Order No. 2020-06-15, entered on January 12, 2022, Temporary Order Governing Trial Court Proceedings, is formally vacated effective **immediately**. Vacating an Administrative Order that vacates a prior Order does not revive the prior Order. Please refer to
